Relief for illegal Carib children

A major think tank in Washington, D.C. says that as many as 1.76 million illegal Caribbean and other immigrants under the age of 31 who were brought to the United States as children could gain a two-year grant of relief from deportation.

The Obama administration said it will begin on Aug. 15 to process applications from young illegal Caribbean and other immigrants expected to seek the deferrals.

PM shakes up cabinet

Haitian Prime Minister Laurent Lamothe has shaken up his Cabinet nearly three months after he was appointed to lead the government.

In an e-mail late Monday, Lamothe provided no explanation for the changes, giving only the names of the new ministers.

Lamothe said he will no longer serve as foreign minister, giving that role to Pierre Richard Casimir.

The prime minister will, however, take on the Ministry of Planning and External Cooperation.

Thierry Mayard-Paul, a close, powerful confidant of Presi-

BAHAMAS

The Bahamas government is buying 11 new vessels for the country's Defense Force and has appealed to nationals not to get into confrontation with nationals from the Dominican Republic on poaching in Bahamas waters.

Agriculture, Marine Resources and Local Government Min-

ister Alfred Gray said a delegation, headed by Foreign Minister Fred Mitchell, is



due to visit the Spanish-speaking country for talks with authorities there on the issue.

Addressing fishermen at a meeting recently, Gray said the newly elected Perry Christie government has agreed to purchase the vessels to complement the four now in operation by the Royal Bahamas Defense Force (RBDF).

He said the four vessels made it difficult for the RBDF to adequately patrol the local waters against poachers.

Gray warned local fishermen against approaching boats from the Dominican Republic and getting into any confrontation.

BAHAMAS

Violent crime in The Bahamas is down six percent overall for

the first half of 2012, according to Commissioner of Police Ellison Greenslade.



The commissioner said that armed robbery, which was up "marginally," was the only exception to the downward trend, but cases of murder, attempted murder, rape, attempted and unlawful sexual intercourse are all down.

He said two cases which had previously classified as murders were recently reclassified as manslaughter.

Up to July, there were 73 mur-

ders for the year so far, police say.

July 2011 was the bloodiest month recorded in 2011, with 20 murders. May 2012 broke that record with 21 murders.

GUYANA

At least three Brazilian min-

ers were reportedly killed after a dredge they were working on capsized in the Cuyuni River recently.



They said investigators were sent to the Bartica area to investigate.

The Cuyuni mining area has been a scene of several tragedies for the year so far. In June, the co-

owner of a mining dredge was shot and killed during an altercation with another man and two miners were killed after a tree branch fell on their mining camp.

HAITI

The Haitian government is promising to hold legislative and local elections before the end of the vear.

Prime Minister Laurent Lamothe told a news conference in Wash-



ington DC recently that the vote will require about US\$60 million to become a reality.

The election seeks to fill 10 seats in the 30-member Senate. The terms of those seats expired in May because elections were n0t held in time.

The race will include posts for mayors throughout the country.

Haitian President Michel Martelly announced in June the creation of a permanent election panel to oversee the vote.

He named a director to the nine-member body but the other seats have yet to be filled.

JAMAICA

Jamaica police say they have "reliable information" that people involved in an illegal lottery scam are plotting to murder the head of the Lottery Scam Force, Superintendent Leon Clunis.

The intelligence arm of the Jamaica Constabulary Force (JFC) said it has reliable information

of the plot as a result of a threat assessment done by the National Intelligence



Bureau (NIB) which was sent to Deputy Commissioner Glenmore Hinds recently.

Clunis revealed that threats have also been made against other members of the task force, but steps have been taken to ensure their safety.

Since its inception earlier this vear the lottery scam task force has managed to disrupt the activities of several people involved in the illegal activity, which has conned unsuspecting Americans out of millions of dollars.

The money is then used to finance lavish lifestyles including the purchase of expensive homes and high-end luxury vehicles.

However, the task force has gone after these assets and has already seized over US4162, 000 and 90 vehicles.

The main opposition Jamaica Labor Party (JLP) has already called on Prime Minister Portia Simpson Miller to demand the resignation of two local government officials, including the deputy Mayor of Montego Bay, following their arrest in the multi-million dollar scam.

Celia "Sherzel" Snell strongly believes her production can fly this Labor Day, as her creation, Sherzel Productions, presents "I Believe I Can Fly" in the Children's Carnival.

"I do this for the fun, because Ilove the kids," said Trinidadian Snell in a Caribbean Life interview at the mas camp, 504 Flatbush Ave., between Lefferts Avenue and Empire Boulevard in Brooklyn.

"Once the kids are happy, that's my happiness," added the producer, who was born in John John, Laventille, but grew up in "Never Dirty" Morvant in Trinidad and Tobago. "I just want to see the band go down the road. That makes me happy.

"It's a lot of sleepless night, but I do it for the love of it," continued Snell in her third successive production for the West Indian American Day Carnival.

She said "I Believe I Can Fly" comprises eight sections: Butterfly (toddlers); Canary; Amazon Parrot; Phirey Phoenix; Caribbean Flamingo; Paradise Peacock; Unicus Unicorn; and Scarlet Macaw.

Snell said the band is allinclusive, meaning that masqueraders also get breakfast, lunch and "unlimited supplies of juice, drinks;" and parents of registered kids get a free T-shirt.

She said she's catering for 300 kids, competing in the

large band category, with more than half already registered.

In 2010, the first year of production, the band placed first in the medium size category, with 132 kids. Last year, it placed third in the large category, with 247 kids, Snell said.

But she said, despite her relative success, her primary goal is having fun.

"I love this," she said, as a team of volunteers, including her husband, Roderick Snell, son of renowned Trinidad masquerader Morris Stewart – 12-time King of the Bands – aids in costume preparation. "This is my passion."

Kameron Slade is in the fifth-grade at PS 195 in Rosedale, Queens. Over two months ago, when he was assigned to write a speech, he went home and told his mom he wanted to write on something that was not discussed much.

It was just about the time that President Obama had publicly supported same-sex marriage. This was the topic—with his mom's support—Kameron Slade chose to write about.

Kameron won the class competition but was not allowed to deliver his speech to the school-wide competition. Principal Beryl Bailey deemed the topic inappropriate.

At the school assembly, Kameron gave a speech on animal cruelty.

Meanwhile, Kameron's story went viral, broadcast all over the Internet.

With Commission Den-

nis Walcott's intervention, a few days later, the speech was delivered to his fellow fifth graders; the principal had time to alert parents.

On Wednesday, July 25, Kameron Slade was highly rewarded for such guts and independent thinking. At City Hall Council Chambers, Kameron received a citation and then, with the full City Council in attendance, Kameron redelivered his speech to a captive audience.

Among City Council members standing with the young statesman was Speaker Christine Quinn who married her female life partner in May and Queens City Council member Jimmy Van Brammer, who told the assembled he was getting married the upcoming weekend.

Before he began, Kameron said, "I think adults must realize that as

children get older, they become aware of these mature issues that are going on in the world. If children read or watch the news, they can also learn about things like same-gender marriage, so what's the point in trying to hide it?"

In his speech, he refers to spending time with two women, his mother's friends who are in a relationship. "They seemed like any other family," he said. "The only difference was that they were two moms instead of a mother and father."

Wyclef Jean shows support at AIDS march

Mega superstar musician Wyclef Jean used his celebrity clout and freestyle rap to rev-up a crowd of thousands that gathered on the mall of Washington Monument, urging them in the words of Bob Marley to "Get Up and Stand Up For Their Rights." He was among other artists during a day of activism and March on Washington to end the AIDS pandemic.

Jean took to the stage wearing a white shirt, and later stripped down to all black as he sweated under the swelter heat on July 22, singing his hits, "Shakira Hips Don't Lie" to "Ready Or Not" and others.

The Grammy award artist waded into the crowd singing "Everything Is Gonna to be Alright," and continued with Marley's "Trench Town" and "No Woman No Cry."

Jean encouraged the spectators to "Keep the Promise" - the theme of the 2012 International AIDS Conference in Washington that opened with the live concert, and speeches by prominent politicians, activists and talk show hosts.

Hosted by comedian, and TV personality Margaret Cho, the afternoon was punctuated by Jean's loud

support for the AIDS community. He broke into his native Haitian patios, as he wowed the crowd, and told them to demand that the U.S. and other governments keep their promises to fund global relief programs in an effort to end AIDS.

The sea of red umbrellas that blanketed the mall were hoisted in support of the myriad of speakers like the Ambassador Andrew Young, the Reverend Al Sharpton, TV personalities, Tavis Smiley and Dr. Cornel West and Global Advocate Michael Weinstein, who all called on the crowd to pledge to hold the government accountable for the cuts in funding for AIDS program.

Sharpton said, "We must march for those that stand up; we are not marching in silence and shame. Civil rights are for everybody, or nobody."

World-renowned AIDS advocate and apartheid fighter, the Archbishop Desmond Tutu delivered a powerful message of hope via satellite.

The International AIDS Society, located in Geneva Switzerland hosted the XIX AIDS conference in Washington DC, where 26000 delegates from around the world convened until July 27.

Over 1 million illegal Carib youth could gain relief from deportation

Obama said certain young people who came to the United States as children and meet other key guidelines may be eligible, on a case-by-case basis, to receive deferred action.

In its latest report, the Migration Policy Institute (MPI), an independent, non-partisan, non-profit think tank dedicated to analysis of the movement of people worldwide, said its estimates are up from the 1.39 million it released on Jun. 15.

MPI said the latest figures reflect the updated Department of Homeland Security (DHS) guidelines that youths lacking a high school or equivalent diploma would be eligible to apply for deferred action, as long as they have re-enrolled by the date of their application.

MPI estimates that 350,000 unauthorized young adult immigrants, ages 16 and older, without a high school degree or

equivalent could potentially be eligible for relief from deportation if they meet the enrollment criteria.

"The deferred action initiative, with its education requirements, offers these youth a significant incentive to stay in school and get their high school diploma," said Margie McHugh, codirector of MPI's National Center on Immigrant Integration Policy.

"And to the extent it raises hopes for eventual passage of the DREAM Act, it may encourage thousands more to set their sights on a college degree," she added.

The U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) director Alejandro Mayorkas said applicants will be charged US\$465 for each request.

He said applications, which will also include requests for work permits, will be considered individually, with each immigrant

undergoing a criminal and national security background check.

Mayorkas said information from the applications would not be used for immigration enforcement, which is handled by a separate agency.

Nevertheless, he said Caribbean and other immigrants found to have serious criminal histories or to pose national security risks would be prosecuted for deportation, and anyone submitting a fraudulent application could face criminal prosecution.

Mayorkas said illegal immigrants can apply whether they are already in deportation proceedings or they have never been detected by the authorities.

He said applicants who have committed a felony, a "significant" misdemeanor like a firearms or burglary violation, or three or more misdemeanors will not be eligible.



MARCUS GARVEY DAY PARADE IN BROOKLYN

Jamaica's first national hero will be regaled by a parade through Brooklyn. Culminating with a concert and revelry, the 125th anniversary of the birth of Marcus Garvey will be remembered on Saturday, Aug. 18.

Starting at noon, at Avenue D & Albany Ave., the event will also honor the island's Prime Minister Portia Simpson-Miller and pay tribute to Jamaica's 50th anniversary of independence.

Co-ordinated by Paul "Jah Paul" Haughton, the publisher of Revelation Rastafari Newspaper, the annual celebration is expected to attract "conscious humans who believe in One Love."

It was Garvey's aim to promote "One Love, One Aim, One destiny," in his quest for unity.

Born in 1887 in St. Anne's, Jamaica, Garvey founded the Universal Negro Improvement Association at age 27. It was then that the motto of the organization – "One God! One Aim! One Destiny" was adopted. "Therefore, let justice be done to all mankind, realizing that if the strong oppresses the weak, confusion and discontent will ever mark the path of man but with love, faith and charity towards all the reign of peace and plenty will be her-

The CMO was quick to point out that there could be more of the disease in the island as not all cases have been detected, indicating she is trying to avoid panic.

Hand, foot and mouth disease is a human syndrome caused by intestinal viruses. It usually affects infants and children and is contagious.

The CMO advised that persons should take the necessary precautions to prevent the spread of the illness.

SURINAME

Suriname state-owned oil company Staatsolie is considering selling stock through a

partial privatization similar to those carried out by



state energy firms in Colombia and Brazil, a company official said.

Shares will also be sold in telecommunications firm Telesur and Suriname Air-

ways, which are state-owned and the Hakrin Bank, which is partly owned by the government.

The official said the company is preparing to conduct a study on a possible share offer in Staatsolie, which could help finance exploration of onshore and offshore areas that have drawn interest of overseas oil companies.

Suriname will likely approach any stock sale with caution given that a plan to privatize Staatsolie in 1999 met with widespread protest that ultimately forced the president to leave office.

"Staatsolie wants to explore the possibility of issuing shares," said the company's General Manager Marc Waaldijk in a statement.

TRINIDAD

Former Trinidad and Tobago National Security Minister Martin Joseph was 'hog-tied" and robbed at his upscale home at Flagstaff recently.

Joseph said in a statement around 11.30 p.m. on July 22, 2012 he was at his home

at Flagstaff, when his stepson entered the house.

"I noticed that a masked man armed with a gun had followed him into the house. Upon entering the house, the man announced a robbery and proceeded to hogtie my stepson. There was a short confrontation between

the gunman and as I tried to wrestle the gun from



his hands, I too was hogtied as the bandit proceeded to rob me and others in the house.

"The robber then made his way upstairs to the bedrooms of the house and it was during that time I was able to untie myself, escape and call for help. The police were contacted and they arrived shortly after on the scene."

The bandit managed to escape in his stepson's car, which police later found abandoned a few miles away.

Bloomberg fails to support civic-based anti-gun efforts

For years Mayor Michael Bloomberg has campaigned against the easy availability of guns.

This is a laudable goal as guns continue, even in low crime years, to take the lives of hundreds of New Yorkers. Bloomberg has also spoken out about the easy availability of assault weapons, which have played an important role in numerous mass killings such as last month's theater shooting in Aurora, Colorado.

Bloomberg's approach has been one of prohibition. He has urged Congress and local legislators to ban or otherwise restrict a growing list of guns as the best strategy for reducing the daily violence on inner city streets and in high profile incidents. To accomplish this he has spoken out personally, using his bully pulpit as the billionaire mayor of New York City, spent millions on media campaigns—including during the Super bowl, and spent big money to support pro-gun control politicians.

What these efforts share is that they are focused on stopping the supply of guns. Through new legislation and improved enforcement Bloomberg hopes to take guns out of the hands of the criminals. This is prohibition and interdiction at its finest and mirrors closely the effort to control drugs in the U.S.

The problem is that this approach has completely failed to reduce the availability of illegal drugs and has little chance of meaningfully reducing access

to guns

While guns are harder to manufacture than drugs, the legal and political challenges to their being banned are much greater than for drugs. The efforts of the NRA combined with the ambiguous language of the Second Amendment almost guarantee that the manufacture and sale of a wide variety of guns will continue apace in large parts of the US. Bloomberg's War on Guns has the potential to be as great a failure as the War on Drugs has been.

What then is the alternative? We need to do more to address the demand side.

For many youth in our society guns are a symbol of power in world in which they are largely powerless. From suburban high school kids who are taunted and bullied to poor urban kids, who face failed neighborhoods, failed schools, and bleak economic prospects, the gun has a strong appeal as a tool of empowerment, however misguided or self-destructive.

If we are ever going to make substantial progress against gun violence in the U.S. we need to do more to address the needs of these young people by helping them to find alternative paths to personal safety, economic security, and psychic well-being.

This is exactly the work being done by hundreds of dedicated community activists across the country, who are working with young people to try to make up for some of the deficits of family and community they encounter.

Strengthen state oversight of fracking

I first heard about fracking (the drilling of natural-gas wells using a method known as hydraulic fracturing) in 2009 when environmental advocates charged that natural-gas drilling could endanger New York City's water resources. I lived in the city at that time, so the news that natural-gas drilling could threaten my drinking water was alarming.

Many other New Yorkers shared these concerns, and the question of whether or not to allow fracking in the state flared into an ongoing political battle, one being reenacted across the 30 states where natural-gas drilling is occurring. Nearly half a million natural gas wells are operating across the country, with more than 313,000 in just six states: New Mexico, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Texas, and West Virginia.

OMB Watch, a government accountability group I lead, recently published a new report on fracking, The Right to Know, the Responsibility to Protect, and what we found is troubling. Disclosure of chemicals used in fracking is spotty and incomplete.

States have begun to respond to citizen complaints, but no state requires enough upfront collection of data and monitoring of drilling operations to ensure protection of local water supplies.

Here's how fracking works: A well is drilled thousands of feet vertically into the ground (through the water table). Then a horizontal hole is drilled into a shale bed, extending laterally from the first well bore. A "fracking" mixture comprised of thousands of gallons of water laced with sand and toxic chemicals is pumped into the well at extremely high pressure. This fractures the shale rock, which releases methane gas that is captured and sold. Once you visualize this process, the potential risks of contamination to water supplies are obvi-

You're probably thinking: Isn't there a law against poisoning water? The answer is yes (the Safe

Drinking Water Act) and no (a clause was inserted into the 2005 Energy Policy Act, exempting natural-gas drilling from that drinking water law). Just as hydraulic fracturing was getting cheaper and the demand and price for natural gas was rising, federal oversight was removed.

Our report examined actions state officials have or have not taken to require drillers to disclose chemicals used in fracking. Roughly a dozen states have passed a law or had agencies establish a rule requiring disclosure. But there are two gaping holes in these laws that render them essentially toothless.

First, owners and operators of natural-gas wells are not required to gather baseline information on sources and quality of water near their planned well sites before drilling. Without baseline water and air quality measurements, local communities can't test to see whether water sources are being contaminated. Measuring before drilling occurs is just common sense, but no state requires this. Only a few states even require companies to report the chemicals they'll use before fracking begins.

Does diplomatic immunity apply here?

"...she blew the cover off our political pretensions, revealing us as a people represented by arbitrary, opportunistic power to which merit and standards are no particular concern."

Trinidad Express columnist Sunity Maharai, who can always be relied upon for sober, thoughtprovoking insights on social reordering in Trinidad and Tobago, was referencing a diplomatic misfit who had been posted to Geneva by Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar after an abortive tenure as minister of health. Alas, the lady became an instant cause célèbre and a much viewed YouTube source of embarrassment for T & T nationals following a speech she delivered ("37 minutes of uninhibited rambling," quipped Maharaj) in an international forum.

Curiously, Maharai's mention of merit and standards being of no concern applies seamlessly to a quite disturbing situation that has arisen at the Trinidad and Tobago Consulate in New York. No less an individual than the country's ambassador to Washington, Neil Parsan, was quoted in a recent newspaper report as having described morale at the

consulate as slipping into negative territory, following the abrupt firing of eight employees, several of them long-serving staffers with individual records of service going back as many as 20-plus years, and the imposition of arbitrary, regressive contract stipulations for employees who, for the time being, still have a job. At the apex of this sordid turn of events is the Consul General Rudrawatee Nan Ramgoolam who, like that ill-conceived Geneva deployment, was shipped off to the New York Consulate gig after likewise coming up short in a cabinet post.

Ever since, with the attainment of republican status, a Trinidad and Tobago Consulate was established in New York, the consul general's post has always been occupied by a career diplomat. Politicizing of the position has been the handiwork, one presumes, of either Persad-Bissessar herself or the man to whom she gave the foreign affairs portfolio, Suruj Rambachan. Rambachan is well known to be an unadulterated, unapologetic racist. Whether he was doing his administration's bidding or engaged in some freeform soloing, there probably was

not much room for doubt in Rambachan's intent, given the man's pedigree, when he told the consulate staff in an early meeting with them, that the face of the consulate would have to change. In Consul General Ramgoolam, the foreign affairs minister evidently had a kindred spirit perfectly aligned with those new designs for the consulate operation.

In Trinidad, Reginald Dumas, former head of the public service, expressed misgivings when told of a written exam to which consulate staff members were subjected as part of the re-applying process to retain a place in the new order (as mandated by God-only-knows whom). Unquestionably well versed in these matters, Dumas was guizzical: who authorized such an exam, who set the exam, who marked the papers, how were the papers graded...? Added to which if, as is understood, the exam consisted primarily of ques-

tions about consulate functions and procedures, it does seem quite peculiar that members of the public seeking first-time employment at the consulate were given the very same test. All of which may have played into the nature of a report said to have been submitted by Ambassador Parsan about consulate goings-on, and which has now reportedly occasioned a halt to the consulate's "restructuring" ambitions, pending cabinet review.

In the meantime, however, there's the matter of a community of Trinidad and Tobago nationals still to be served by a consulate staff devastated by draconian measures the likes of which might elicit a scowl even from Wisconsin's unabashedly anti-labor governor. No kidding! The employees dismissed in early July, in one instance after 23 years' unbroken service, were simply told they hadn't been successful in the exam and were being immediately terminated -- with no separation package whatsoever. The employees who "passed" the exam would learn that this entitled them to "temporary" status on a six-month contract which could be terminated on one day's notice, and which included absolutely no benefits (they previously worked under two-year contracts that included typical employee benefits). Added to which, at the end of the six-month "temporary" stint, they would be required to break service for a week and could then be offered another temporary gig for six months! The circumstances here are

so bizarre, one wonders whether we aren't witnessing another instance -- not uncommon in Persad-Bissessar's administration -- of process being paid scant courtesy, of governing authority being ascribed open-ended liberties it does not possess. The celebrated case of a junior officer, bogus credentials and all, being geared to become the country's security chief remains perhaps atop the highlight reels of process discarded. Process hasn't been a factor either in the case of the notorious Jack Warner, where malfeasance or the appearance of it hasn't derailed his cabinet ranking, and with a law-unto-himself disposition still very much intact as he goes about state business.

Bauxite town buries dead, talks to end impasse

Government and opposition officials in Guyana last week held the first major round of talks aimed at resolving the political impasses that followed last month's police killings of three opposition supporters and injuries to more than 20 but latest indications are that the angry residents of the bauxite mining town of Linden are digging in their heels for a protracted fight with the governing People's Progressive Party (PPP) administration which has so far bowed to only one of their key demands to review planned steep increases in electricity rates.


Since the July 18 deaths by out of control riot police, residents have locked down the town of 30,000 and have occupied the lone river bridge at the upper reaches of the Demerara River that provides access to the road to Brazil and to four administrative regions where most of the country's gold and diamond mines, timber concessions and other crucial investment projects are located, sending up food, fuel and other prices.

Worried about the ominous signs from residents who have faced down heavily armed police and soldiers each day since the senseless police shootings, umbrella private sector organizations that usually support the PPP have asked it to invoke good sense and come up with a sustainable economic plan for the community that basically depends on the Chinese-run bauxite sector for its existence.

At the heart of issue were planned steep hikes in electricity rates for Linden from the beginning of last month. For most in the community, authorities were taking up the rates as direct punishment and spite for the overwhelming anti-PPP vote in the late November general elections. Government said it wanted the community to pay the same rates as others in the country, ignoring heavy subsidies it gives to pro government sugar workers year after year.

So they took to the streets to protest the increases in a well publicized fiveday campaign that escalated on day four when police opened fire randomly after plunging the area in darkness, killing the three and injuring many.

This past Wednesday, the bodies of the three were brought to the city for a ceremony and later taken back to the district for services and internment even as residents continued to block access to the town and the key interior regions.

As an indication of how the situation could worsen, protestors have dug huge trenches across dirt roads that could have allowed 'the enemy' to circumvent the road blocks and still reach the interior.

Opposition officials say they will maintain the pressure on President Donald Ramotar and his cabinet after using their one-seat parliamentary majority to pass a no-confidence vote in National Security Minister Clement Rohee as the week began.

Additional rounds of talks are scheduled to address other access including releasing the state media control of Linden, an employment plan and oth-

Jamaica's citizen security program

The United Kingdom Department for International Development (DFID) will contribute US\$11.3 million to expand a citizen security program designed to reduce crime and violence in high-risk communities in Jamaica.

Jamaica, which has the highest homicide rate in the Caribbean, has identified citizen security as one of the most pressing issues. To address it, the Jamaican government has developed a long-term, nationwide crime prevention strategy and is carrying out targeted efforts to improve citizen security conditions in five parishes with the highest incidence of serious crimes.

The UK grant will help the Jamaican government reach a total of 50 communities under its Citizen Security and Justice Program (CSJP), currently financed with a US\$21 million IDB loan approved in

2009. At present, the CSJP is being carried out in 39 communities with risk factors such as gang presence, high youth unemployment rates and a generalized sense of lawlessness.

The CSJP builds in international best practices for strengthening community mobilization and governance, expanding social and economic inclusion opportunities for young people and prompting a law-abiding culture. According to assessments by the Planning Institute of Jamaica, communities participating in the program have experienced sharp decline in homicides, shootings and violence-related injuries.

Part of the UK grant will enable the Jamaican government to cover administrative costs and expenses incurred by the CSJP in order to avoid disruptions in the services and activities in the communities where the program is already in operation.

Real drop in Guyana's mother-to-child HIV infection

Guyana health officials have made a stunning claim that their aggressive approach to eradicate mother to child transmission of HIV will result in a zero count by the year 2015.

In the year 2000, approximately 800 women gave birth to babies infected with HIV. However, the tide was turned last year when the number with infants affected with the virus decreased dramatically.

Minister of Agriculture, Leslie Ramsammy announced these findings during a presentation at the recently concluded International AIDS Conference in Washington, DC, stating that 12 years ago, almost 200 babies were born with HIV, but in 2011, only six infants were born with the virus.

The decrease, he said, was due to overall testing and treatment with antiretroviral medicines, which dramati-

cally decreased the chances of transmittals, resulting in the low death rate.

"Our approach is to fighting the HIV and AIDS epidemic," Dr. Ramsammy said, "is to put in place an initiative to educate the masses, and policies and strategies for reducing and eliminating the stigma and discrimination."

Director of the National AIDS Program Secretariat, Dr. Shantie Singh, who was a part of the Guyana delegation in Washington, said in an exclusive interview with Caribbean Life said that Guyana has made "tremendous strides in the social and cultural norms, and progress in testing over 95 percent of the Guyanese population, including promiscuous persons and mothers who were at risk of transmitting the

virus to their children."

"We can safely say that Guyana is the first country in the Caribbean that has been working from the onset to elimiminate mother-to-child transmission," Dr. Singh said, adding that at the end of last year, 100,000 citizens were tested -- a significant number, she said, considering Guyana's population of 800,000. Those tested were homosexuals, female commercial sex workers, men having sex with men and high-risk groups. "This is a remarkable achievement," she added.

The number of people coming forward has increased, and statistics show that this is the reason for the increased survival rate, Singh said.

A question was raised about why school-age children are not being provided with condoms. Singh said it was a cultural matter in the Caribbean because of the

age-of-consent issue and added that the government of Guyana has instituted a health and family life program in high schools, in response to the AIDS epidemic. This program, she added, gets additional support from non-governmental oganizations (NGOs) which send workers into schools to talk about factors that influence the high risk of HIV/AIDS.

"Like other Caribbean countries, we have been addressing the topic of condoms in school," Dr. Singh said.

FDA approves anti-HIV pill

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has approved the anti-HIV drug Truvada for PrEP, the first drug to reduce the risk of HIV infection for uninfected individuals.

The FDA's approval is for those who are at high risk of HIV infection. Truvada for PrEP, or pre-exposure prophylaxis, is strongly recommended to be used in combination with other prevention methods such as safe sex practices, risk reduction counseling, and regular HIV testing in order to reduce the risk of acquiring HIV.

A program has also been established to ensure that Truvada as PrEP will be used safely and appropriately.


The drug Truvada is a combination pill of two HIV antivirals (emtricitabine/tenofovir) that is already FDA approved for the treatment of HIV infection. Truvada as PrEP should be taken daily.

"Today's approval marks



an important milestone in our fight against HIV," said FDA Commissioner Margaret Hamburg, M.D. "Every year, about 50,000 U.S. adults and adolescents are diagnosed with HIV infection, despite the availability of prevention methods and strategies to educate, test, and care for people living with the disease. New treatments as well as prevention methods are needed to fight the HIV epidemic in this country."


Others agreed that Truvada for PrEP could play a significant roll in reducing HIV transmissions.

Obese and overweight adults now outnumber those at a healthy weight; nearly seven in 10 U.S. adults are overweight or obese.


With good reason, childhood



Talking tech as an economic driver

There is a tremendous amount of money in Tech! Along with it is a huge drive to identify and support via investments, the next generation of leading tech companies!

There is a movement underway to add diversity into the Tech communities! Yet Blacks and in particular Black women, have not jumped at the opportunity.

It's time to start "Talking Tech" as an economic driver.

Partners Bonnie Sandy and Antonio Mark have challenged a group of their peers to accept responsibility and lead.

As a partner in Tibiae Tech, Inc and Brooklyn community liaison for the Newme commune, Sandy accepted another challenge to pull together a Brooklyn Business Conference/Expo with a tech focus to coincide with the influx of Caribbean nationals visiting NewYork City during the West Indian Labor Day celebrations! Her focus is to ensure our community is not left behind in the digital revolution! Educating and informing on the current state of development is a vital part of that process!

To ratchet up the effort, a call is being made for spon-

sors/partnets, others vested in the economic development of our community to participate in this event!

Sandy, a Black female, has been in the New York Tech room since 2005/6. In the past seven years she has taken what she learned and shared it with the community. Now, together with co-has been has been founders she is starting a tech startup, Tibiae Tech Inc, in Brooklyn with plans to expand into the Global Diaspora community.

Growth is natural for Sandy. At the beginning of this year, she agreed to partner and become lead architect of Tibiae Tech Solutions Inc., a New York-based tech startup that is in the business of change management;

addressing the glaring problem of the lack of minorityowned businesses in today's tech sector and the adoption of technology in today's business culture.

For her, it meant putting aside her design work so that she could reconfigure an approach that was culturally relevant! Seven months into the process they understand the gargantuan task they have undertaken but are frequently reminded that there is no other solution! "It is overwhelming, but we are focused on a legacy of change!" Sandy opined.

Ten cofounders and partnering sponsors later, brings them to the next phase – securing space! Each cofounder is an expert in their field with experience working with, consulting or servicing local entrepreneurs. The first order of business was to bring them up to date with the technology, where it currently is and where it is headed, and strategizing on cultural adaptation. Ten co-founders and partnering sponsors later, brings them to the next phase – securing space!

Tibiae Tech Solutions Inc. will provide technology, funding, mentorship, incubation, marketing and distribution to enable experts in niche local micro sectors who answer the question "What would you do with technology if you could?" to access and develop technologies, focused on scalable next generation concepts.

There is a lot of talk about "Changing the Ratio" and increasing the numbers of minorities and women on the start-up scene! Tibiae Tech's goal is to increase the number of minority, especially Blackowned startups within the New York tech landscape. Few know of The New York Tech Meetup, a non-profit organization with over 25,000 members supporting the New York technology community, which is the lead organization.

In a population estimated in 2011 at 8,244,910 that is a mere dent. Yet that sec-

tor is thriving. Of the more than 350 startups on the Tech Made in NY about 85-90 percent is hiring!

Starters, many do not know exactly what is the "Difference between a Startup and a Small Business?"

One google search defines the Difference Between a Startup and a Small Business. Both are exactly the same, except how the owner thinks about their business. A small business owner is focused on doing it tough for a number of years and hoping they can make it as a business. However a startup thinks big, they dream of their application/ product or service being used by millions around the world and funded by VC's and that is how they direct their business. Small business owners think about doing things slowly and building their business over time.

According to Sandy, "It takes 50-58 hrs to plan a new business". While some startups are designing that blueprint in as little as three days, small businesses may take six months to a year or more --often at a huge financial cost, that eventually causest heir demise!

Then there is the challenge of execution. Having an idea is one thing successfully

bringing an idea to market is another!

Thus, far many local businesses are unable to take advantage of new and emerging technology to address issues in their sector. Few understand the scope and capabilities and as such they are unable to innovate, cut cost and increase turnover and revenue. On the other hand few tech developers and even investors understand the challenges within the sectors. Local mom and pop businesses require the same resources and must execute at the same level to ensure success.

Earlier this month Tibiae Tech began leading a select group on a self-guided online series that will bring to light where current technology is at and how small businesses can leverage their experience and eventually create startups that will not only "address needs in their niche but by adapting early, garner valuable market share!"

Participants were asked to set aside a minimum of 28 hours to research and educate themselves. Free to the first users (few spots left) this version would be followed by workshops and tech talks during August!

resources of the city are right next door."

Dr. Steven C. Tawil: Colon Cancer Screening & Prevention

Stop postponing your colonoscopy.

Everyone age 50 and over needs one, but African-Americans are at an especially high risk of developing colon cancer, says Dr. Steven C. Tawil, gastroenterologist and internist.

"It is recommended that they be screened for colon cancer at age 45," says the doctor.

The reasons the mortality rate is higher for African-Americans is not known, says Dr. Tawil, but the good news is that having this simple procedure "can improve the numbers."

It has never been easier or more convenient to undergo this procedure. It can be done right in Dr. Tawil's Brighton Beach office, with an anesthesiologist present.

"This means it is an 100 percent painless procedure," says the doctor.

The administration of the anesthesia is quick, so patients feel no pain, he assures. The presence of the anesthesiologist also means that a patient's vital signs are constantly being monitored.

"It's another pair of hands in the room, another doctor checking oxygen, heart rhythms, and pulse," says Dr. Tawil. "It's all about the comfort and safety of the patient."

Make an appointment to see him if you have rectal bleeding. This could be a sign of colon cancer, and should never be ignored, says the

doctor. A change in bowel habits or unexplained weight loss are other reasons to undergo an exam. If there is a history of polyps in the family, being screened is a must, he says. Polyps are small growths that occur on the wall of the colon, and if they are not removed, some may eventually turn into cancer, says Dr. Tawil. The removal of polyps can be done right after the colonoscopy is performed, while the patient is still under anesthesia. That way, patients don't have to return to get another proce-

Patients can also come to him to get their blood pressure checked and their sugar levels monitored. He also treats heartburn, ulcers, constipation, liver issues, and stomach ailments. He specializes in the treatment of hepatitis, particularly hepatitis C.

"We have the latest treatment, available right in the office," he says.

Dr. Tawil's credentials are impeccable. He is boardcertified in internal medicine and gastroenterology, which means a "double certification," he notes. 

Poor response to Haiti's needs

The United Nations says it is cutting back on the amount of international aid money it is seeking to help Haiti because the response from donors has been disappointing so far this year.

The UN Humanitarian Coordinator (UNHC) in Haiti, Nigel Fisher, said that funding for remaining humanitarian needs clearly is insufficient and that the original budget for 2012 had been estimated at US\$231 million.

He said by midyear, only 20 percent had been received to help Haiti as the French-speaking CARICOM country recovers from the January 2010 earthquake that killed an estimated 300,000 people and left more than a million others homeless.

According to the UN, as a result of the slow response from international donors the new budget has been put at US\$128 million.

"The original budget for 2012 for Haiti was US\$213 million. However, in the middle of the year, the consolidated appeal was only funded by 20 percent. Therefore,

facing this sharp reduction of humanitarian resources available, the humanitarian country team and national authorities have revised the consolidated appeal at the mid-term review," he said.

The consolidated appeal seeks international funding to support Haiti's most vulnerable population affected by humanitarian crises. Three sectors still need urgent support.

The UNHC said while cholera epidemic has diminished, it remains at epidemic proportions with 50,000 cases reported so far for this year.

It said the number of people still living in camps following the earthquake has declined to 390,000, but with the hurricane season going on till the end of November, funds are needed for preparedness and emergency response.

OCHA head in Haiti, Johan Peleman told reporters that a withdrawal of donors has had an impact on managing shelters and IDP camps, the health sector, the water sector and the sanitation and protection sector.



"I will just be telling (my) story," Tyson said.

"People have said the story mesmerizes." When asked if any aspect of his life was off limits, the former boxing champ said, "If anything comes across kind of fake, (you'll) see it right



away. To avoid that, (I'm) putting everything on the table. But it's not all good stuff! It's going to be a roll-ercoaster of emotions."

Directed by Academy Award nominee Spike Lee, the actor/director is making his Broadway director debut with this presentation.

"Human beings want to hear stories. Whether it's a play, a documentary...a song, a musical, a novel or a movie, we love great stories, and we love great storytellers. And, with Mike Tyson on the stage, you are going to hear a great American story... Mike's a great storyteller,"Lee said.

The autobiographical production was written by the boxer's wife Kiki along with Randy Johnson.

The show is slated for a

limited run at the Longacre Theater and ends on Aug. 12.

Bronx and Brooklyn teens bask in Olympic glory

Sports fans in the Bronx and Brooklyn are on a high after watching two of the early competitions of the Olympic contests in London. After swimming and gymnastics performances, Brooklyn's 17-year-old Lia Neal will bring home an Olympic medal.

borough of kings crowned 17-year-old Neal the water queen after she swam the third leg in the women's freestyle 4×100 relay.

Her effort powered the US team to win the bronze medal.

Neal's role in determining the outcome of that race puts her in the Olympic history book — with the first Black — as the second African-American woman to do achieve that feat.

Not only is Neal the second African American woman to medal in swimming in Olympic history, she is also the second to make the U.S. Olympic team.

Maritza Correia was first

to claim the honor. She won a silver medal in the 4×100 freestyle relay in 2004.


Neal lives in Brooklyn and started taking swimming lessons when she was six. By the time she was eight, she had joined the swim team and started training at Asphalt Green Unified Aquatics on the Upper East Side of Manhattan.

And while many swimmers are known to hail from Florida, California and other warm-weather coastal states, Neal comes straight out of Brooklyn.

Her father Rome Neal is a talented actor who won an AUDELCO Award for his portrayal of jazz legend, Thelonious Monk in an Off-Broadway production.

Her brother Rome is a senior video web producer at the New York Post newspaper. After his sister's victory he penned an article in honor of her success which was posted at the website.

Da'Ville's 'Krazy Love'





She created her company, Weyu Le, in March 2008 as an organic food business in Los Angeles. "Weyu Le" is Garifuna and means "This is the sun" or "This is the way," and together, "Weyule" means "today." She is currently transitioning Weyu Le into a creative education company that blends music, dance, theatre and education. Erica is also the director of Arts and Cultural Performances for GAHFU (Garifuna American Heritage Foundation United) and the director of GAH-FU's Lidereibugu Garifuna Ensemble (LGE). "Lidereibugu" means "Powerful" in Garifuna and is a cultural vocal, dance, and drumming group based in Los Angeles, California. LGE's objective is to continue preserving a rich Garifuna culture through songs, dance and drums. Their legacy is to maintain and share the Garifuna language with the world. LGE dances the traditional Garifuna dances – such as Hungu-Hungu, Paranda, Chumba, and Punta, as well as Garifuna-American routines with a contemporary twist.

Érica recently performed with The Caribbean Heritage Organizations' "Tribute to Hollywood" Gala event at the Hollywood Forever Park; a "Forum and Fundraiser for Haiti" with actor and activist Danny Glover. She has also opened for Aurelio Martinez at Los Angeles "Gran Festival Hondurenisimo" and the "Punta Rock for Education Summer Concert." She is also a member of the Central Avenue Dance Ensemble (CADE), a multi-aged performance group led by Chester Whitmore. She travelled with Chester to Russia in May 2011 to perform a variety of dance styles - Tap, Lindy Hop, Swing, Be-Bop, and Charleston - with the Smithsonian Jazz Masterworks Orchestra (SJMO). She performed at several special concerts with SJMO which featured music and songs by jazz greats Duke Ellington, Count Basie, Jimmie Lunceford, Benny Carter and Benny Goodman.

Tribute to the human spirit of a Rasta rock god

When most people think of Bob Marley, what probably comes to mind is reggae, Jamaica and marijuana. But how did a street urchin raised by a teen-mom in a country shack with no electricity manage to become a beloved icon admired all over the world?

That little-known side of Bob's life story is the subject of Marley, an intimate biopic produced by his son, Ziggy, and directed by Scotsman Kevin Macdonald. Because of the participation in the project of so many relatives, friends and colleagues, the picture paints a fascinating portrait which fully fleshes out its subject, thereby resisting the temptation of merely placing him on a pedestal.

At the point of departure we learn that Robert Nesta Marley was born in 1945 to Cedella Malcolm, a young local gal, and Captain Norval Marley, a British plantation overseer already in his 60s. Bob never really knew his father or the rest of the Marleys, a prominent family with a construction business on the island. In fact, his request for financial help to kickstart his career was rebuffed out of hand by his relatively-rich white relations.

Rejection was a recurring theme during Bob's formative years, when he was teased as a "half-caste" by other boys for being mixed. And he was equally unpopular with the opposite sex, since "Every girl's dream in Jamaica was to have a tall, dark boyfriend." He was even abandoned by his mom who moved to America while he was still in his teens.

Fortunately, Bob eventually found salvation through a love of music and the embrace of the Rastafarian community. Seeing his guitar as a way out of poverty, he let his hair grow while writing popular songs about equality, world peace, and cannabis, which is considered a sacred herb by the dreadlocked adherents of his pot-smoking religion.

After struggling to make it for over a decade while getting ripped-off by unscrupulous producers and promoters, Marley finally landed his

big break in 1973 when he and the Wailers signed with Island Records. The group went on to record such hits as

"One Love," "Jammin'," "No Woman No Cry," "I Shot the Sheriff," "Redemptive Song," "Get Up, Stand Up," "Stir It Up" and "Is This Love?" to name a few.

The 21/2 hour combination concert/interview flick allocates a decent portion of time to archival footage of The Wailers' performing many of the aforementioned anthems. Attention is also devoted to the reflections of folks like Bob's widow, Rita, who talks about how she was really more of her his guardian angel than his wife.

After all, he had 11 children by seven different women and often needed help juggling his groupies and baby-mamas. As Bob's attorney. Diane Jobson, explains it, her client considered himself faithful to God, if not his spouse.

Among Marley's many lovers was gorgeous Cindy Breakspeare, Miss Jamaica 1976, who went on to win the Miss World title. Not so lucky was Pascaline Ondimba, the daughter of the African nation of Gabon's prime minister. She recounts how Bob had called her "ugly" because she straightened her hair, and had encouraged her to cultivate and appreciate her natural beauty.

Sadly, Marley's life was marked by tragedy, too, including an assassination attempt and later the skin cancer to which he would succumb at the tender age of 36. Still, his "One Love" legacy is likely to withstand the test of time and inspire generations to come with its allembracing message of understanding and tolerance.







Grenadians celebrated with a public holiday the small Caribbean island's first ever Olympic Gold medal when 19-year-old Kirani James (The Jaguar) won the 400 meters men's at the Olympic Stadium at the 2012 Summer Olympics, London on Monday, Aug. 6.

There was jubilation in the streets of Grenada, especially in James' home village, Gouyave from where Prime Minister Tillman Thomas congratulated him in London after he accomplished the remarkable feat.

Prime Minister Thomas said James' victory was an inspiration to the country

"He is a real good role model for our young people. He's very disciplined, very organized and very focused," Thomas told reporters.

PM Thomas gave Grenadians a half day

holiday on Tuesday.

James, already the world champion became the first non-U.S. athlete to run the distance in under 44 seconds. His time of 43.94 seconds is the fastest ever by a Caribbean athlete in the 400 meters.

"I am very proud for my country and everyone who is affiliated to my country and me. Words can't explain," he told reporters in London after his victory.

Gordon got home in 44.52 seconds in the men's one-lap final to secure bronze, joining 1964 silver medalist Wendell Mottley.

Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bisessar also sent a congratulatory message to Gordon saying his achievement had brought glory and pride to Trinidad and Tobago with his medal-winning performance.

"As a small twin-island state, we have once again

made out mark on the world stage with excellence in the international sporting arena," Persad-Bissessar, who was in Jamaica attending the island's 50th anniversary celebration said.

This top Mets prospect is on a tear

Brandon Nimmo has been swinging for the fences — ever since he actually started swinging at pitches.

The 19-year-old and first-round Mets draft pick struggled early in the season, when his greatest asset seemed to be his ability to draw walks. But now he's on a tear, batting .372 in his last 10 games and going on a seven-game hitting streak between July 28 and Aug. 4.

Clones skipper Rich Donnelly says it's all because the kid from Cheyenne, Wyo. has been willing to take risks at the plate.

"He's just been more aggressive," Donnelly said after an Aug. 2 matchup against the Connecticut Tigers in which Nimmo kept his streak alive with a single in the bottom of the eighth. "He's swinging earlier in the counts, and not just waiting to get a walk."

Nimmo has racked up the

most bases on balls of any Cyclone — 29 for the season, compared to 22 for left fielder Stefan Sabol and shortstop Philip Evans.

But since July 26, he has only picked up two walks. Meanwhile, he has come to lead the team with 46 hits (16 of them in the past two weeks) and 28 runs (11 of them in the past two weeks).

Donnelly said he and hitting coach Bobby Malek remind the center fielder daily to step up to the plate and swing — a skill the manager said is necessary to the red-hot prospect's future in the sport.

"He's going to progress by hitting the ball, not by walking," said Donnelly.

For Nimmo himself, the improvement has been more mental than physical. The ballplayer joined the Clones straight out of high school and the high expectations left him tense and mechanical at the plate — and unwilling to

take chances on pitches.

Now he says he was just psyching himself out.

"The worst pressure is the pressure you put on yourself," Nimmo said. "But lately I've just been relaxing, not worrying about whether I got out, just trying whenever I get up there."

Nimmo is still working to pull himself out of the hole he dug early in the season: he's batting just .264 on the year. But the Cyclones number nine says he isn't letting the past bother him.

"You just try to go up there every day and get your ball when it comes. Because they don't always come often," Nimmo said.

Not bad for the youngest everyday player on the Mini-Mets — as Donnelly is quick to note.

"He's playing up," said Donnelly. "He's a freshman playing on a varsity team. But he's mentally mature. He makes guys like me feel embarrassed."






